

Enabling Plugins in Windows Browsers

Mozilla Firefox – When a plugin is blocked, you'll see a notice asking you to activate the plugin, and a small icon resembling a LEGO block on the left side before the address. Click the LEGO block icon, and you'll get a pop up asking to you allow. Click the "Allow and Remember" button. You may need to refresh the page after.

You will need to switch to a browser that supports legacy plugins to view the page, such as Firefox or Internet Explorer.
